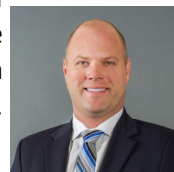

TALK WITH TED

Last year, the Town purchased two small lots along Agate Ave., one across from High Country Motors (0.46 acres) and the other between Fat Cat Café and Blue Federal Credit Union (0.29 acres). The motivation for said purchases is to add greenspace or parks along the main pedestrian corridor. What the spaces will look like has yet to be determined. The designing firm we hired, with the help of a DOLA grant, will seek public input on the many possibilities the spaces hold: a natural playground, a veteran memorial, native garden, food truck location, etc. Please keep an eye out in the coming months when the designer, Michael Baker International, seeks public feedback and ideas.

Also in 2023, the Town was awarded \$1.35 million toward completing what is commonly referred to as the “Halfway Pathway”. Come May, the Town plans to begin construction that will connect the trail from the cart barn of Grand Elk to the Thompson Road/Highway 40 intersection thus completing the Granby portion of the 16 mile Fraser to Granby Trail. Completing this small section of trail has been in the works for a while and we’re happy to see it come to fruition.

The Town expects to close on a conservation easement for the property north of Sun Outdoors (formerly River Run) in April. This area will provide outdoor recreational opportunities for our citizens and visitors while still maintaining the intrinsic value of the land and wildlife that live there. After mud season (date TBD), we’ll invite the public for a sneak peek into this closed landscape before the trails are added. We hope to see you there. -Ted Cherry, Town Manager

WATER DEPARTMENTS

North Service Area: The new rates are in place effective Jan. 1, 2024 (\$298.66 facility fee + \$12.47/1,000 gallons) billed quarterly.

South Service Area: Rates remain the same covering water and sewer at a flat quarterly rate of \$318.77. Granby Ranch lots pay the \$55.00 DeBerard Draw Fee.
