**Background:** Previously the Board had discussed the possibility of putting in a bike track skills course in at Kaibab Park, but with the current railroad museum configuration that is not a possibility anymore. Additionally, Trustee O'Flaherty approached staff about the possibility of putting in a pump track that could be better suited to some of the needs of the community.

A skills park is a bike track with more difficult terrain that can teach skills that can be used for building mountain biking skills. A pump track is the type of facility which is used to learn skills, but is designed to use the rider's momentum to get around the track.

Staff would like to facilitate a discussion about possible bike facilities in the community and if the Board believes they are necessary. The Parks Master Plan from 2011 does not take into account any type of bike facilities as a need for the community.

Staff spoke about the possibility of create a Parks and Recreation public committee, similar to the Public Arts Committee, that would allow for staff to work with some engaged community members on the needs of what the community desires. Additional there has been some talk about updating the Parks Master Plan that could be used as an engagement tool for such a committee and the Board moving forward.

Space that could be dedicated to a bike area would be available to Rafferty Park, Morales, and by the dog park. These spaces are limited and would need to be worked through on benefits and drawbacks of each area.

**Financial Impact:** N/A

**Recommendation:** Staff would like to discuss the possibility of some type of bike park, or if the Board would like to see more information on what those could possibility be, cost involved, and maintenance long term. Additionally, would the Board like to explore the option of creating a Parks Committee or updating the 2011 Parks Master Plan.
