ORDINANCE NO. 916**

**AN ORDINANCE ADDING CHAPTER 2.95
ESTABLISHING A PUBLIC ART COMMITTEE FOR THE TOWN**

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Granby, Colorado, pursuant to Colorado Statute is vested with the authority of administering the affairs of the Town of Granby, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, in response to community concerns regarding the planning, programming, procurement, installation and maintenance of public art projects and artworks in the Town of Granby the Board of Trustees finds it in the best interest of the Town of Granby to establish the Public Art Committee to act in an advisory capacity to the Board of Trustees related to such projects and artworks;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF GRANBY, COLORADO, THAT:

1. The Granby Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding Chapter 2.95 to read as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto.
2. **Severability.** If any article, section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional or invalid for any reason such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each part hereof irrespective of the fact that any one part or parts are declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid.
3. **Repeal.** Existing ordinances or parts of ordinances covering the same matters as embraced in this Ordinance are hereby repealed and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or committed in violation of any ordinance hereby repealed prior to the taking effect of this Ordinance. Except as specifically amended by this ordinance, all other provisions of the Granby Town Code shall remain in full force and effect.



Chapter 2.95 Public Art Committee

2.95.010 - Purpose.

There is hereby created a Public Art Committee for the Town, which shall also be known as the PAC (hereinafter referred to as "Committee" in these rules of procedure), composed of a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of seven (7) members, who may perform all functions currently or hereinafter authorized by this Chapter and future ordinances adopted by the Board of Trustees.

2.95.020 - Members.

- (a) Committee members shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees.
- (b) The Board of Trustees may appoint ex officio members to the Committee who shall not have any voting rights.

2.95.030 - Terms.

The term of Committee members shall be four (4) years.

2.95.040 - Responsibilities.

- (a) The Committee shall act in an advisory capacity to the Board of Trustees as requested by the Board of Trustees and Town Manager.
- (b) The Committee is authorized to explore matters related to all aspects of planning, programming, procurement, installation, operations, and maintenance of public art projects and artworks in the Town of Granby and make recommendations to the Board of Trustees and Town Manager.
- (c) The Committee shall hold at least one (1) regular meeting each quarter. A quorum is not required to hold a meeting. No vote or recommendation to the Town Board shall take place without a quorum.

2.95.050 - Chairperson.

The Committee shall elect a Chairperson from among the members. The term of the Chairperson shall be one (1) year with eligibility for reelection.

2.95.060 - Eligibility.

All members of the Committee shall be bona fide residents within the 80446 zip code, individuals who own property within the Town, or individuals who own a business within the Town. Committee members should provide a broad representation from the community and interest in promoting the best interests of the Town; be objective and thoughtful.

2.95.070 - Resignation, removal, and vacancy from Committee.

(a) Any member of the Committee may resign by providing written notice to the Chairperson of the Committee.

(b) Members of the Committee may be removed, by resolution of the Board of Trustees for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office. The Mayor or the Board of Trustees, as the case may be, shall file a written statement of reasons for such removal for consideration by the Board of Trustees.

(c) Any vacancy on the Committee, whether through the tender of resignation, expiration of the term, or removal by the Board of Trustees, shall be filled by Trustees by appointment at a regular Board meeting.

2.95.080 - Expenditures and employees.

The Committee is not authorized to hire any employees or expend any Town funds. The Town Manager will assign staff and make other resources available as he or she deems appropriate.
