### TOWN OF GRANBY ACKNOWLEDGES ANNIVERSARY OF SIGNIFICANT EVENT

June 4, 2024, marks the 20th anniversary of the tragic day when a Granby resident drove a modified bulldozer through Town destroying 13 buildings and ultimately taking his own life.

While residents will acknowledge that day in their own way, the Town of Granby is responding to the anniversary with the community's safety in mind. "Safety was, is, and will be one of Granby's highest priorities," said Josh Hardy, Mayor. "We remain intolerant of violence and destruction of any kind."

Beginning in early June, there will be an increased police presence in the town, and information will be released to the community as needed. Further, Town officials are reminding the entire community that violence and destruction do nothing but hurt the Granby community.

"It's impossible to ignore the impression this event has had on those who were here twenty years ago and the continued impact this history has on our current community," said Hardy.
